Alleged Violations:

On or about September 2003, at 20752 SW 120th, Tualatin, Oregon, Respondent installed a Manchester pressure vessel, National Board #164698, for the account of another, without first having obtained a valid pressure vessel installation permit, in violation of ORS 480.630(6).

On or about May 30, 2002, the Board of Boiler Rules approved a Consent Order in case 2002-0155, finding the Respondent installed two pressure vessels for the account of another, without first having obtained valid pressure vessel installation permits, in violation of ORS 480.630(6), and assessed a \$2,000.00 civil penalty. The Consent Order stayed \$1,750.00 of the civil penalty for three years from the date of the Order, provided the Respondent did not violate any provisions of the Oregon Building Codes, Statutes, Administrative Rules, Specialty Codes, or any Order issued by a State Building Codes Advisory Board. The \$1,750.00 is now due and payable.

On or about March 29, 2004, a pressure vessel installation permit, #04-25517, was issued by the Division, and the installation of a Manchester pressure vessel, National Board #164698, located at 20752 SW 120th, Tualatin, Oregon, was inspected and approved.

Other Comments:

Respondent admitted the violation occurred and agreed to the entry of a Consent Order acknowledging a commitment to comply with the Oregon Specialty Codes. Compliance has been achieved in the matter. The Respondent was assessed a

\$3,750.00 civil penalty. The Respondent will pay \$2,750.00, and the \$1,000.00 balance of the civil penalty will be stayed for a period of three years. The stayed civil penalty will be discharged at the end of the three-year period, provided there are no subsequent violations during the three-year period.
